

NARI Remodeler of the Year Award Judging Process

A NARI Remodeler of the Year (RotY™) Award winner is an entry that demonstrates remodeling excellence based on a strict set of criteria. Entries are judged on functionality, problem-solving, aesthetics, craftsmanship, innovation, the degree of difficulty, and entry presentation.

Scoring Criteria

RotY judges will consider the following to determine the points they will award to each entry for each question.

Score Section	Definition
1-3	Did not address the question
4-5	Addressed the question, but minimally
6-9	Met the minimum
10-12	Went above the minimum
13-15	Exceeded the minimum requirement, showed innovation in addressing the question

Providing the project scores above average, the entry with the highest rating in each category within a region determines the regional winner.

All regional winners within each category are reviewed again by the judges to determine the national winners. In some cases, no regional winner is found to merit a national award, underscoring the high standards to achieve national recognition.
