



Path Through NARI Leadership

All NARI members in good standing are welcome and encouraged to volunteer. This document is an outline to help understand how the national organization functions and how members may be involved in leadership at local and national levels.

There are no roadblocks or restrictions on involvement in a committee or on becoming a national committee chair or officer. It is suggested that volunteers participate at the chapter level, if they are part of a chapter, however chapter leadership is not a requirement to participate on a national committee. National Members and Industry Partners are eligible to participate on a national committee or the Board of Directors.

We encourage all members to speak with other volunteers, their Chapter Executive Director, or NARI national staff, and/or sign into [NARI's online community](#) to spark a conversation.

Volunteer participation directs the future of NARI and the remodeling industry.

Suggested steps to consider:

1. **Members can volunteer their time and attend functions** at the chapter level, if a chapter is in their local area (chapter leadership hierarchy may differ).
 - a. Get involved with a local committee.
 - i. Understand how committees and local chapter governance operate.
 - b. Chair or Co-chair/Vice Chair a committee.
 - c. Move to local board position (See local guidelines).
 - d. Be appointed as Chapter Representative of House of Delegates - NARI Bylaws Article VI section A.
2. **Get involved with national committees** - NARI Bylaws Article IX, section C, item 1
 - a. All members, including National Members and Industry Partners, should discover opportunities and connect with NARI National staff by logging into [NARI's online community](#).

3. **Become Chair or Vice Chair of a Standing Committee** - Chairs are recommended by the Executive Committee and approved by the House of Delegates, and Vice Chairs are selected by the Committee Chairs. Make yourself known to NARI leadership so you can be considered for one of these important roles.

- a. Chairs of standing committees or councils automatically serve on the Board of Directors. NARI Bylaws Article VII Sections A-B

4. **Service on the Executive Committee as a National Officer** - NARI Bylaws Article VIII Sections A-F

a. Qualifications:

- i. Attended three of the last six House of Delegates meetings.
- ii. Has served as a Chair or Vice Chair for (1) one full term.
- iii. Is a member in good standing.
